

Hood Museum Board of Advisors Mutual Learning Fellow, Curatorial & Exhibitions

The Curatorial & Exhibitions Fellow will gain deep understanding of curatorial work and best practices. Under the mentorship of the curatorial and exhibitions teams, the Curatorial & Exhibitions Fellow will learn how to care for, develop, and exhibit a museum art collection.

Over the course of three years, the fellows will learn and engage in:

- Research-based data entry on accessioned material (collaboration with curatorial team)
- Rights and reproductions for exhibitions-related content (PR, catalogs, other uses)
- Working with curators & educators to develop online collections resources (for teaching, research, public engagement)
- Contributing to the development and implementation of online exhibitions and exhibition-related content
- Supporting intern research/acts as the intern point person for digital platforms, including TMS
- Working with curators, preparators, and exhibitions manager to create digital renderings for exhibition planning in programs such as SketchUp
- Learning how (and then overseeing) data entry process for loan shows, including records of artworks, loans and lenders, and coordinates with registrars and exhibitions managers on shipment-related information
- Supporting collection growth in diverse research areas
- In collaboration with curatorial advisors and registration staff, working on museum deaccessioning
- Working with curatorial team to conduct research and determine best practices and possibilities for future international repatriations
- Collaborating with Communications team on curatorially-focused posts on museum social media and blog content
